

Sunday December 10th

"and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart." (Isiah 30:30). Today's Gospel sheds the undimmable light of the voice in the wilderness, preparing the Lord's way. That voice is none other than John the Baptist, cousin of Jesus, and herald of God's promise fulfilled. It describes John as a radical, unassuming, wild man of sorts. Yet all the same, he had a following (including eventual followers of Jesus) because the truth holds no assumptions, no agenda, no popularity contest.. It just IS. As attributed to St. Augustine, "the truth is like a lion, you have only to set it free and it will defend itself." Coincidently, the symbol of Mark's Gospel (where our reading is from today) is a lion because of John's zealous proclamation of truth, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" Are we ready for him?

Fun fact: each Gospel writer has a symbol attached

Matthew: A Man, signifying the genealogy of Jesus that begins his Gospel and His human lineage. Mark: A Lion because of it's opening from John the Baptist, unapologetically strong, like a lion of truth! Luke: An Ox because Zachariah (John the Baptist's father) was sacrificing an Ox at the beginning of his Gospel when Gabriel appeared to him.

John: An Eagle because of his understanding of God's light of Truth like an eagle's ability to stare

straight into the sun.





Tuesday December 11th... By now the Christmas trees at St. Colette have been up for guite some time! You'll see them soon enough... for now we wait! Perhaps a tree adorns your home as well with the tradition of just how that occurs—real or fake, white or colored lights, homemade or decretive ornaments, or both, a star or an angel. A German tradition, the Christmas Tree is a sign of life amidst dead of winter, color amidst the brown of a dormant season. As Christians, the symbolism of this is so obvious, and on a personal level for each of us, so meaningful. As you enjoy the glow from your tree tonight or anticipate the coming occasion you decorate it... or remember the memories from Christmas trees of yester year, let that life revive your spirit and the colors refresh your perspective on the rest of the week.

December 12th~ Our Lady of Guadalupe

A "Golden Hail Mary" is said to be one prayed with one's whole mind, heart, and soul, priceless in Mary's eyes. In honor of this feast day and of Elizabeth's greeting to Mary in today's Gospel, let's pray a Golden Hail Mary today— heart, soul, mind. Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Wednesday December 13th~ The Feast of St. Lucy

Sweden in particular, though many European countries celebrate Santa Lucia Day! (St. Lucy Day) with lots of Christmasy festivities centered around light. St. Lucy is the patron saint of eyes and blindness. It is said that she used to bring food to the imprisoned and illumined the path to the cells with a candle wreath she placed on her head. At many Santa Lucia festivals, someone plays the roll of St. Lucy wearing this iconic wreath. May her glorious martyrdom, life for Christ, and undimmable light of God illumine our Advent journey. St. Lucy, pray for us! Saint Lucy's Prayer:



Saint Lucy, you did not hide your light under a basket, but let it shine for the whole world, for all the centuries to see. We may not suffer torture in our lives the way you did, but we are still called to let the light of our Christianity illumine our daily lives. 
Thank you St. John of the Cross for your witness to that love... pray for us!
