



RCIA Rite of Sending & Election... by Noah

At the Rite of Election, the catechumens and candidates go through a change in identity. As once seekers and now catechumens, the Ordinary of the Diocese, the Bishop – on behalf of the universal Church, pronounces the catechumens to be The Elect, those to enter the Church at the Easter Vigil this year. This is a very powerful moment for both adults, teens, and children alike who participate in the Rite of Election. Not only can some as young as seven years of age barely write their name in the Book of the Elect, but their faith in doing so is extremely profound – a witness to the entire community of faith that newness of life is possible. A catechumenal culture recognizes what it means to be chosen, abandoned – like Christ, and crucified with Him. Not only does this step in the journey visibly recognize the transformation that has taken place thus far and foreshadow what is to come, but it should be a moment for the entire community of faith to assess their spiritual walk with the Lord.

When seeing the catechumens and candidates sent for the Rite of Election, I encourage you to ask yourself, "How am I being transformed?"

A catechumenal culture is one **where everyone is converted**; so, how have you been converted or *re-converted* more intimately to Christ?
