St. Colette is certainly a blessed, holy place. Thank you, Fr. Montavan for your astonishment at the Lamb of God, for "looking for him", and for serving him so beautifully. We are forever grateful.

In May of 2000 I was to have double bypass surgery so Jan called several local parishes to have a priest visit and hear my confession. No priest was available from any of the parishes to make the visit the day before surgery. Jan called St. Colette asking if Fr, Montavon could come to the hospital. She was informed that Father had a very busy schedule that day and may not be able to make the visit.

Jan came to visit me that evening and I said to her, guess who came to visit me today, Fr. Montavon. Father came this afternoon and heard my confession and gave me a blessing as well. Father had taken time out of his busy day to make this visit.

Because of Fr. Montavon's kind action Jan and I decided to join St. Colette Parish. I made arrangements with the diocesan website manager to take over administration of the St. Colette website and provide information about our parish as well as local parish activities. Jan and I became ushers for the next several years.

Jan and I still speak fondly of Fr.Montavon when we converse with others about the early days of St. Colette Church being constructed. We are very grateful for the time we shared with Fr. Montavon. Yes we remember his faithful dog companion, Matins.

Remembering Fr. Tom Montavon Bill and Jan Spring Our family knew Fr. Montavon for 20 years. He had an influence on our son to become a priest. He invited Joel to spend time with him in the rectory. He gifted him a couple books. Father even attended a Brunswick high School swim meet to watch Joel swim.

But, a young lady came into Joel's life. He is married with 3 children.

Things that I remember:

- \*\* Father always wore his collar, his black suit, white shirt with cuff links to celebrate Mass.
- \*\*I had taught PSR. One evening he came to visit classrooms. It was the first time I saw him in a regular colored shirt.

- \*\* He loved his dog Mattins.
- \*\* He loved his martinis.(I think)
- \*\* He had a unique sense of humor.
- \*\* For many years he sent our family Christmas cards.
- \*\* Thank you Father for being our first shepherd at St. Colette Parish. Renate Elber



I remember going to Mass at Crestview School when our parish was first formed in 1977. If my memory serves me correctly, we only had two Masses and if you went to the later Mass, 10:00 or 10:30, you had the fold up and put the chairs away so the children could have school on Monday.

Sometime after the formation of our parish, I received a phone call one Sunday evening from my next door neighbor on Nancy Circle, whose house was up for sale, saying that he had sold the house. He would not tell me the buyer's name but gave me many hints to try to guess. He said the fellow was very well educated but kind of quiet and laid back, was single with no plans to get married and that he had leadership qualities and many other hints. Finally, after I could not guess, Gary mentioned it was Father Montavon.

Shortly after moving into the home, Father had a chapel built in the basement. He was a quiet neighbor although he came to many of the picnics, rib roasts and clam bakes that we would have on the circle. At the time there were only about 6 or 8 Catholic families out of the 20 plus homes, but Father fit in very well with all of them. Once the lower level of the Church was completed, we were able to move from Crestview school for Sunday Mass and services. A year or so later when the present Church, Rectory and residences were completed, Father moved from Nancy Circle. He was a good neighbor and a good Pastor. Rest in Peace.

Another tidbit about Father, was that when we were getting married and went to Pre-Cana classes at St Albert the Great parish, newly ordained by a year or so Father Montavon was our instructor.

### Those Who Seek the Truth

In my work as a freelance writer, I have a regular column in the archdiocesan paper writing profiles of ordinary people in the local church. Laity, religious, and clergy alike — I hound them all to give me an interview, and when I do, the answer is almost always this: "You don't want to talk to me. There's nothing special about me."

I always try to convince them that there is something remarkable about everyone who is searching for the truth. It is easy to think we are not made for holiness because we are ordinary people with ordinary habits, ordinary abilities, and ordinary sins. It is easy (and very convenient) to designate holiness as something belonging to Better People. People like the saints. People like the Disciples.

The Bible gives us next to no personal information about the disciples. There is no archdiocesan newspaper profile on Andrew and Simon that can give us insight into who they were before they became St. Andrew, Inaugural Disciple and Announcer of the Messiah, and St. Peter, First Pope and the Rock-Upon-Which-Christ-Built-His-Church.

Yet I find myself insatiably curious about it. What was their childhood like? What games did they play with each other as the sun set, before their mother called them into bed? What did they think of as they fell asleep at night? What secret jokes did they share to make each other laugh? What were they afraid of? What did they hope for? Who did they want to be?

Before they were towering figures of salvation history, Simon and Andrew were just two men searching for the truth. When they looked at Christ, there was something that made it click. Perhaps they themselves could not identify what it was, but their hearts whispered it nonetheless: There it is. We finally found it.

Isn't that the best we can all hope for?

"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?'" — John 1:38  $\cite{CLPi}$ 

Lectio Divina— translated "divine reading" or simply, praying with Scripture... the Bible is God's Word, living and effective for all time. Take a minute throughout the week and contemplate what God is saying to you through this Sunday's readings as if he were speaking just to you... because He is!

In the Lord's call to Samuel, Eli teaches Samuel the importance of "listening" to God's voice. Can you name something you have heard from the Lord?

### **Second Reading:**


Paul saw our physical bodies as a temple of the Holy Spirit, destined to be raised after death just as Jesus was raised from the dead. What are some ways to treat your body with reverence and respect?

### Gospel:

In John's account of the call of the first disciples, we hear the first words Jesus speaks in the Gospel of John: "What are you looking for?" Be honest, upfront with Jesus and tell him what you are looking for! He already knows, but he wants you to trust him enough to tell him. ©LPi



# Saint of the Week!

St. Sebastian, Martyr. D. 288
Patron of athletes, solders
and those who desire a
saintly death.
Feast Day: January 20th

What we do know, however, has certainly shaped the sanctity of the church every since! A martyr of the third century, Sebastian is known as the "saint who was martyred twice." He was a Roman solider under the rule of Emperor Diocletian, one of the most ruthless persecutors of Christians, Sebastian himself, however WAS a Christian, and used his status to help other Christians imprisoned or encourage them in their faith when faced with death. He converted many to Christianity while in his position. Word reach Diocletian of his activities and Sebastian was tied to a stake and shot with arrows for solider target practice (famously depicted). His executioners thought he was dead and left him there... but he was not ("martyrdom #1). Sebastian was found and nursed back to health. only to return to Diocletian himself and face him for his atrocities to Christians. His words fell on deaf ears, despite Diocletian's awe. Sebastian was clubbed to death and his body thrown in the sewer. It was later recovered by Christians and buried. His relics remain in Germany to this day.
