Remembering Fr. Montawon

I would like to recall some wonderful memories about Father Montavon. First of all, we have a tremendous appreciation of how he started our parish as a young priest who said "yes" to the bishop to an undaunting task of finding an open field in Brunswick with no parishioners. He literally went from door to door looking for Catholics who would be willing to sign up to join a church that still did not exist.

That first "Church" was in the gymnasium of Crestview School and the first rectory was a home on Nancy Circle. Daily Mass and Baptisms were in a small chapel in the basement of that home.

My first meeting with Father was Mass at Crestview gym where he made us feel very welcome with his engaging personality. Father was a great recruiter and immediately got me involved teaching PSR in the class rooms at the Protestant Church at Bennett Corners. He also had Mom's teaching the younger children in the hallways at Crestview during Sunday Mass.

Being very concerned about young families' financial situation, he was very responsible and frugal with the parish finances, making sure he had the means to move ahead with building projects without going into debt.

First came the downstairs, which acted as church, social gathering, classrooms, and offices. His office turned out to be what was designed as a storage closet. Building inside the hill was to save energy costs. Next came the church and the rectory.

Father always remained close to his family and continued to foster a family atmosphere at St. Colette which has continued to this day. Some of my best memories of Father were the times we could spend over coffee experiencing his spiritual side and concern for us as parishioners, as well as his human side with his engaging personality and knowledge of so many contemporary subjects. Besides being very Spartan with his life at the rectory, he never the less enjoyed some fine dining and a good Manhattan.

We can't forget the time his cocker spaniel, Matins, snatched a piece of kielbasa during the blessing of baskets and took off with it.





Saint of the Week


The Conversion of St. Paul... Jan. 25th

One could argue that St. Paul is one of the greatest saints in all the church, often named with Peter. And his story is remarkably fascinating. Unlike Peter who knew Jesus personally, Paul (who's name at birth was Saul) did not. He was a fervent Jew and Pharisee who loved the teachings of the Torah and traditions associated with God's people. He was on fire for the Lord and against any blasphemer— one who takes the Name of the Lord in vain or claims to be God. Saul believed with all his heart that Jesus was indeed a radical blasphemer, along with the Apostles and disciples. He did everything in his power to eliminate Christianity in it's earliest days, certain he was right, certain he was doing the right thing.... But the truth is that in all his knowledge and all the passion he had for tradition and Judaism, he was blind to the God who was right in front of him. As He always does, the Lord had his own way of "opening eyes" to the Light. On a trip to Damascus to capture the Christians there, a great light appeared in front of Saul's path and he was thrown from his

horse. Then a voice... a calm, truthful, yet non condemning voice, calls him by name and asks him one question, "Saul, why are you persecuting me?" It was Jesus, yet not recognizing His voice, Saul is blinded by his ignorance. At that point Jesus instructs Saul to go into the city to await further instruction (Acts 9:5-6). For three days, Saul waits in darkness, and as gold in the furnace being proved and purified he was tormented for his wrongdoing. But God did not forsake him in his darkest hour, but was working behind the scenes. For you see, Jesus also appeared to another man in this story, a faithful disciple named Ananias who he asks to go to Saul and baptize him. For he had a big plan for Saul that would take the church farther than any Apostle would during that time and to this very day. "For this man is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before Gentiles, kings, and Israelites, and I will show him what he will have to suffer for my name." Ananias lays hands on him, and Saul could see again. Then he has a meal (important for the context of this story), and by it, strengthened to preach God's name. It's at this conversion moment that his name is changed to Paul. Name changes in Scripture and in the church today symbolize a new identity in Christ, a new purpose and mission. And Paul would go on to complete four missionary journeys. His letters to the various churches he starts along those trips make up half of the New Testament, including letters to the Romans, Corinthians, Ephesians, Philippians, Timothy, Titus, and more. The beautiful thing about all of this is God didn't despise Paul's passion, boldness, love for the law, and fiery personality... he LOVED it! He made him with it! And he helped him "see" in every sense how he was meant to use it. And that same "conversion" moment is offered to us every time we go to Reconciliation and the priest "lays his hands" on us,



the Church you helped form, to do the same.
