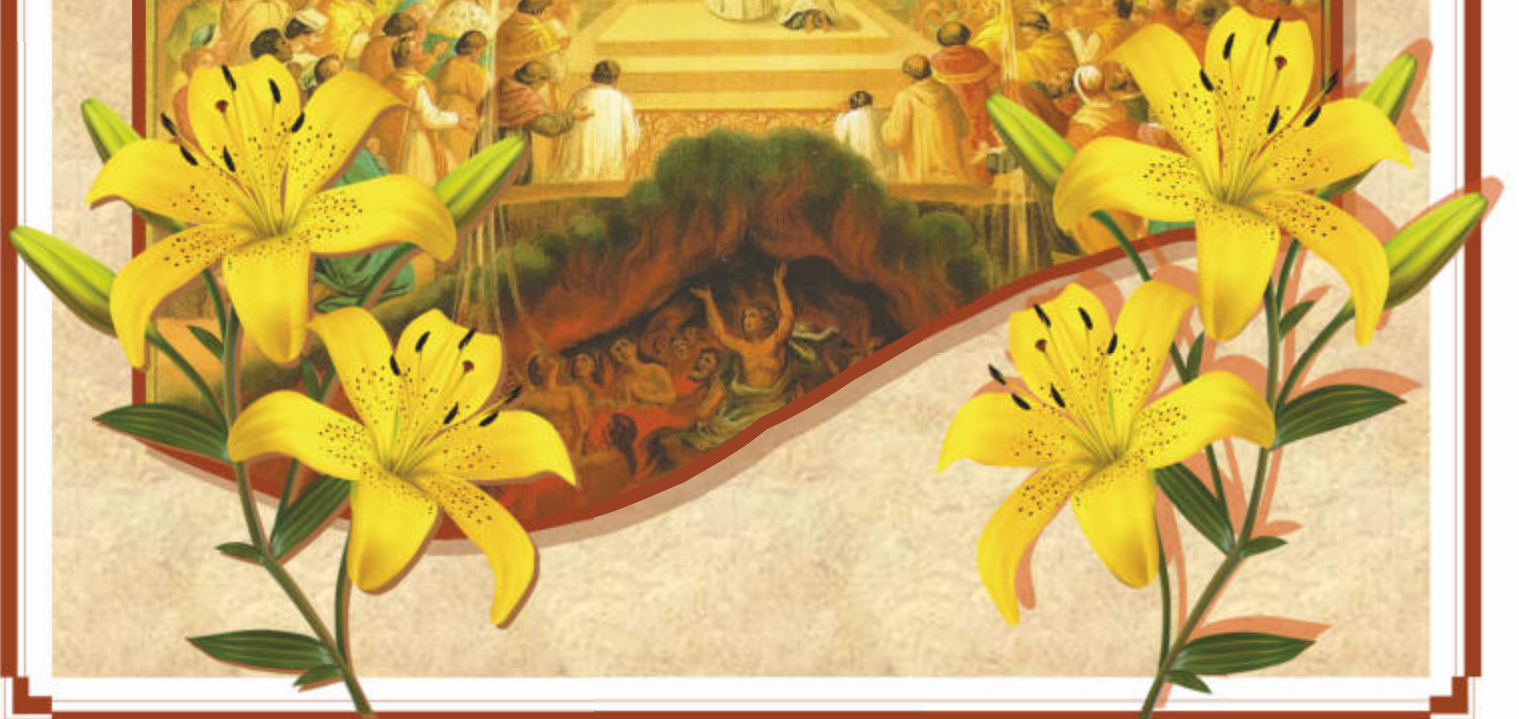

**All Saints**

I remember as a child the meticulousness my father would bring to a task. Whether it be tending to a chore in the yard, repairing something, or painting a room, the tiniest of every detail demanded his attention. He had great patience. I benefited greatly by his example and remember these lessons well. We all need examples to follow. It is important to identify folks who excel at simple things and show us how to do things well. There are those among us and those who have gone before us who serve as these models and witnesses. They are ordinary people who in their “extraordinary ordinariness” capture our attention and allow us to see things more clearly.

These are the prophets, martyrs, teachers, witnesses, heralds, and innovators who bring a single-minded devotion to God to even the simplest of tasks they perform. They have an openness to being used and become vessels of Divine justice, mercy, and presence. They call us to the “more” of life and point us to the Gospel in all of its simplicity and splendor. Pay attention to the details. Do what you do with great love. Know that you are not alone. Believe that you can persevere. Have great faith.

Especially with regard to living the Gospel, we are not alone. A great cloud of witnesses journey with us offering us inspiration, wisdom, intercession, and support. We look to them for the example of perseverance we desperately need in order to be faithful, and for what it means to “walk the talk!” The Beatitudes are indeed a blessed vision that people hunger to hear and embrace. But, they also clearly remind us that following Jesus is difficult. Poverty of spirit, meekness, mercy, and peace making are not virtues readily accepted by the world. Pursuing a purity of heart and acknowledging the hunger of our souls require not only a courageous stance, but a single-minded devotion to God. And, after going against the grain of the world and meeting resistance along the way, the true disciple may find themselves persecuted and paying a high price. Look to all the saints for the secret to happiness and the example of fidelity. Their lives speak volumes of how God can use even the weakest and most humble among us in tremendous ways. The Church leaves it to your own conscience and your own consideration on who will best follow the Law of the Lord and the Law of the Land. Vote with your mind and your heart. Vote with gratitude that we live in a free Nation, a democracy that affords us the privilege of voting. America remains the envy of so many others but it also lives free because of the sacrifices made by so many men and women since its very founding.

On a personal note when I vote I remember my young Uncle who in his 20's gave his life in a B17 over Germany during World War II. I remember my treasured friend who shortly after returning from Viet Nam, lost his young life in an accident—never to know the outcome of those gray days. I remember the encounters I have had with veterans who reject the notion of personal glory yet, in my eyes and so many others, they are heroes! I've mentioned before the cemetery in Pennsylvania (where I had a cottage till recently) and the grave sites of men who had fought in the American Revolution and the war of 1812. Among my most favorite places to visit is Gettysburg—never as a tourist but as someone who walks grounds made hallowed and sacred by the >

countless number of men whose blood stained the grounds of that Pennsylvania town. You see, I believe that when we cast our vote it is a vote that is born in the heroism and valiant sacrifices of our forefathers and the generations that built this country. It is also a vote for those yet to come—for those who follow in our paths and count on us to keep America the land of the free and the home of the brave. It is also a vote for the present as we live in uncertain times and we need the stability and security of a Nation at peace with itself and at peace with the world. I honestly find voting a moving and emotional privilege!

These have been trying times. The division and discord in our nation has led to bitterness and anger — a meanness that I have never seen the like of. The men and women we vote for as Leaders in our Nation must be true leaders: honest and just men and women who have our common good in their hearts and minds. That seems like a lot to ask for—but it is imperative if we are to remain the strong and solid Nation that has been built on the blood and sweat of those who gave their lives for the Red, White and Blue.

In July of 1956 a law was passed in a Joint Resolution by Congress and approved by President Eisenhower that requires “in God we Trust” appear on our currency. This became our National motto.....

We remain committed to this motto with a ‘firm reliance’ on God who has blessed this Nation abundantly. May we be proven worthy of the blessings and worthy of the freedom we enjoy as citizens of a great nation under God with liberty and justice for all. Oh that we had the patriotism that we had on September 12, 2001!


