28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

**Question: Does chewing gum break the fast before Communion?**

**Answer:**

If you look in Canon Law or in the Catechism, there is no mention of chewing gum. I guess it does not rate the attention of the universal church! The Church requires us to fast for one hour before we receive the Eucharist.

Basically, we are to refrain from food and drink, not including water or medicine. There are also exceptions for people who are ill. Overall, the fast is intended for us to prepare ourselves to receive the Eucharist and in some small way to literally as well as spiritually hunger for what we are about to receive.

Chewing gum, while not really food, does at least break the spirit of the fast. Besides that, it is a distraction and rude. What do you do with the gum when it is time to receive

Communion? People have actually come to the altar chewing away, oblivious to what they were doing or Who they were receiving. At best, it is distracting and irreverent. At worst, it adds a barrier to giving our best to receiving God's best.

Caesar, the Chaplain of Southwest who considers St. Colette his new home away from home. For many years the Abbot of St. Andrew's Abbey, Abbot Gary, OSB has been a familiar face and we welcome him each time he visits. We remember as well on this priesthood Sunday, Fr. Montavon, the founder of St. Colette and Fr. Wagner who spent his final years at the parish. We remember the son of the parish, Fr. Redmond, pastor of St. Mary's in Chardon. For all the priests who have served the parish one way or the other and to all those who preach the Gospel we say 'thank you' and may God keep you for many, many years to come!

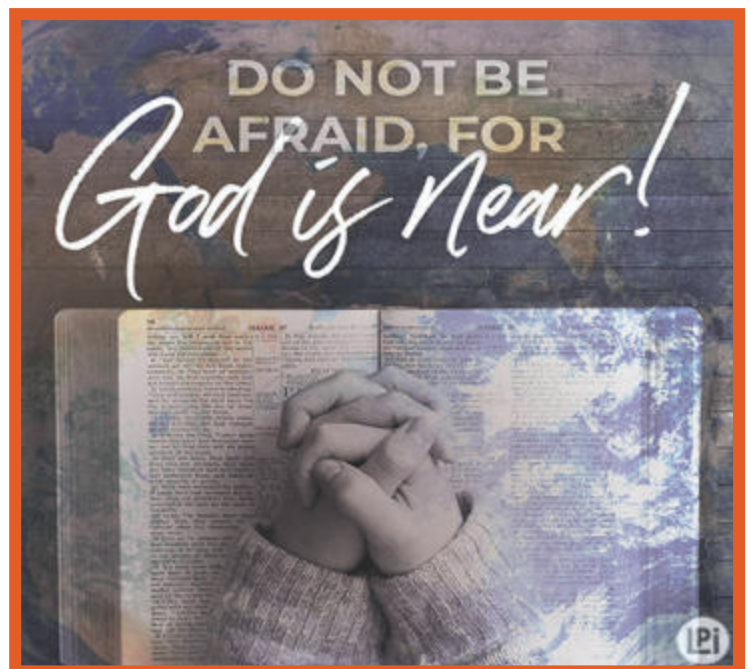
